

Thomas Jefferson, who so famously could not “live without books,” was equally intrigued by maps. Drawing from the Library’s Geography and Map Division, ***Mapping the West*** with Lewis and Clark examines the critical role maps played in Jefferson’s vision of a young republic that would soon be expanding into the largely uncharted western territories. New light is shed on the famous expedition by focusing on the key cartographic discoveries that emerged from the arduous journeys of the Corps of Discovery.

Jacob Riis and his camera captured some of the earliest, most powerful images of American urban poverty and the grim realities of the slums in which the lower classes of New York City lived. ***Jacob A. Riis: Revealing New York’s Other Half*** by Bonnie Yochelson assembles material from five repositories as well as previously unpublished photographs and notes from one of the most influential advocates of modern social reform.

Another new title this year was inspired by the Farm Security Administration’s photography project that documented the country during the Great Depression. ***Facing Change: Documenting America*** by Leah Bendavid-Val collects poignant images of modern America taken by some of the most important, award-winning photojournalist working today.





Jacob A. Riis: Revealing New York's Other Half A Complete Catalogue of His Photographs

Danish-born Jacob A. Riis (1849-1914) found success in America as a reporter for the New York Tribune, first documenting crime and later turning his eye to housing reform. As tenement living conditions became unbearable in the wake of massive immigration, Riis and his camera captured some of the earliest, most powerful images of American urban poverty. This important publication is the first comprehensive study and complete catalogue of Riis's world-famous images, and places him at the forefront of early 20th-century social reform photography. It is the culmination of more than two decades of research on Riis, assembling materials from five repositories (the Riis Collection at the Museum of the City of New York, the Library of Congress, the New York Historical Society, the New York Public Library, and the Museum of South West Jutland) as well as previously unpublished photographs and notes. In this handsome volume, Bonnie Yochelson provides important context for understanding how Riis's work was viewed in turn-of-the-century New York.

Mapping the West with Lewis and Clark draws from the collection of period maps in the Library's Geography & Map Division and other repositories to examine the critical role that maps played in President Thomas Jefferson's vision of a formidable republic that would no longer be eclipsed by European empires.



"All the surveying and mapping that occurred in the American West after the Lewis and Clark expedition, which laid the foundation for its relentless expansion, the expunging of the American Indian ways of life, the exploitation of natural resources to sustain a surging population of immigrants as well as western commerce, can be traced to the maps of Lewis and Clark," says Ralph E. Ehrenberg, the chief of the Geography & Map Division.


The oversized 11" by 14" book contains two loose, pocketed, full-color maps that unfold to 36" x 28". One is a reproduction of Nicholas King's 1803 composite map of the West, which the Jefferson Administration commissioned for the expedition. The other is the first major map of the West that William Clark produced in 1804-05. The 120-page hardcover features a linen cover with a Smythe-sewn binding for longevity and a ribbon bookmark for easy reference to the endnotes.

Facing Change: Documenting America

Published in cooperation with the Library of Congress, this astounding collection of images by award-winning photographers tells the story of today's America—and provides an enduring legacy that will inform the way we address our future. On Inauguration Day, 2009, a group of photographers who were in Washington to document the ceremony began a conversation that led to the foundation of Facing Change. This nonprofit collective has a bold mission: to create a new national portrait of America. Its members include some of the country's most celebrated photojournalists. Their vision is inspired by the Farm Security Administration's project that documented the Great Depression. Chronicling the challenges of modern America, these photographs offer compelling stories of people around the country who are coping with the aftermath of recent events: immigration, health care, housing, the war in Iraq, Katrina, the great recession and profound economic disparity. The book includes images from the original FSA project as well as interviews with Library of Congress photography experts, which together illustrate photojournalism's role in engendering change in America.
